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Mobility programmes CEEPUS & Bilateral programme of academic mobility

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Bilateral programme -

mobility of students (all levels of HE), post-doctoral researchers, scientific researchers, teaching staff throughout the world

CEEPUS – mobility of undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate students & teachers in Central Europe

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Bilateral program of academic mobility

- based on **bilateral agreements** and programmes involving scholarship exchange
- administered by the Agency for Mobility and EU Programmes, in cooperation with the **Ministry of Science and Education**

Calls for scholarships are periodically **published** (depending on the bilateral agreements), for the following countries: Australia, Austria, Belgium (Flanders), Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Canada, China, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, India, Israel, Italy, Japan, Macedonia, Montenegro, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russia, Slovak Republic, Spain, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine, United Kingdom (British Scholarship Trust), USA

SCHOLARSHIPS

- credit or degree mobility (undergraduate, graduate, PhD studies)
- post-doctoral **research**, scientific **research**
- summer/language schools









OUTGOING MOBILITY

- around 90 students, researchers, staff
- France \rightarrow 20, Hungary \rightarrow 15, China \rightarrow 10, etc.

INCOMING MOBILITY around 80 students, researchers, professors France, Hungary, China, USA,...)















Fulbright Fellowship Program





Fundamental principles of international partnership and mutual understanding \rightarrow the core of the Fulbright Program's mission

SCHOLARSHIPS

- pre-doctoral research 2 semesters (9 months) \rightarrow candidates with completed (scientific) master's degree, or enrolled into doctoral program in Croatia
- **post-doctoral research** 1 or 2 semesters (5 to 9 months) \rightarrow candidates with completed doctoral degree
- **EMPLOYMENT IN CROATIA** (criteria of eligibility)

Call for application: 1.3. - 1.5.

Fulbright Specialist Program

- linkages between U.S. scholars and professionals and their counterparts at host institutions overseas
- short-term collaborative projects at eligible institutions in 180 countries worldwide (2-6 weeks)
- curriculum development, institutional planning, various research activities, etc.

Fulbright Specialist Program



FULBRIGHT SPECIALIST:

- presents lectures to undergraduate and graduate students
- participates in or lead seminars or workshops
- conducts needs assessments, surveys, institutional or programmatic research
- consults on faculty development
- develops and/or assesses academic curricula or educational materials
- conducts teacher-training programs at the tertiary level

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JOINT RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS between U.S. and Croatian institutions!

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Outgoing mobility - highlights



United Kingdom

- ("British Scholarship Trust")
- scholarships for research assistents from HEIs and research institutes
- candidates <u>under age of 30</u>
- scientific researches at British HEIs (1 to 3 months)
- Call for applications: December March (end of Febraury)



France

- 9 months graduate and postgraduate studies (degree mobility)
- graduate and postgraduate researches (1 to 3 months)
- candidates under age of 36
- Call for applications: March April





Outgoing mobility - highlights



Switzerland

research scholarships (12 months)

postgraduate researchers

enrolled in doctoral program in Croatia

scholarships for post-doc researches (12 months)

PhD degree, not more than 5 years after the award of PhD

Call for applications: August-November

Hungary



scholarships for postgraduate studies or research (3 to 21 days, or 1 do 10 months)

graduates and postgraduates

scholarships for post-doc studies/research (3 do 21 days, or 1 to 10 months)

PhD degree

Call for applications: February - March



















What is **CEEPUS**?

Central European Exchange Program for University Studies

- academic exchange program for students and university teachers
- Multilateral agreement 16 countries (Croatia joined in 1996)
- CEEPUS CENTRAL OFFICE → National CEEPUS Offices
- UNIVERSITY NETWORKS
- Focus on joint programs → Joint Doctoral Programs
- No transfer of funds participating country finances incoming mobility

CEEPUS Networks

CEEPUS Networks – partnerships of a <u>minimum 3 participating units</u> (HEI's or single departments) \rightarrow <u>1 coordinator</u>, other institutions are partners; from at least <u>3 different participating countries</u>

Who can join or establish CEEPUS Network?

In Croatia, only public faculties and polytechnics can join CEEPUS
